## AUGMENTED EXHIBITION

The best in physical display and augmented reality combine to create a fully immersive historical experience that is engaging and easy-to-use for all ages.

Each visitor is issued a HistoPad, a portable, touch-screen tablet developed by Histovery that will serve as a portal to enter history.

With the HistoPad tablet, visitors explore freely, meet historical figures, embark on treasure hunts, and track down war relics and iconic objects of the Revolution, uncovering stories at their own rhythm.

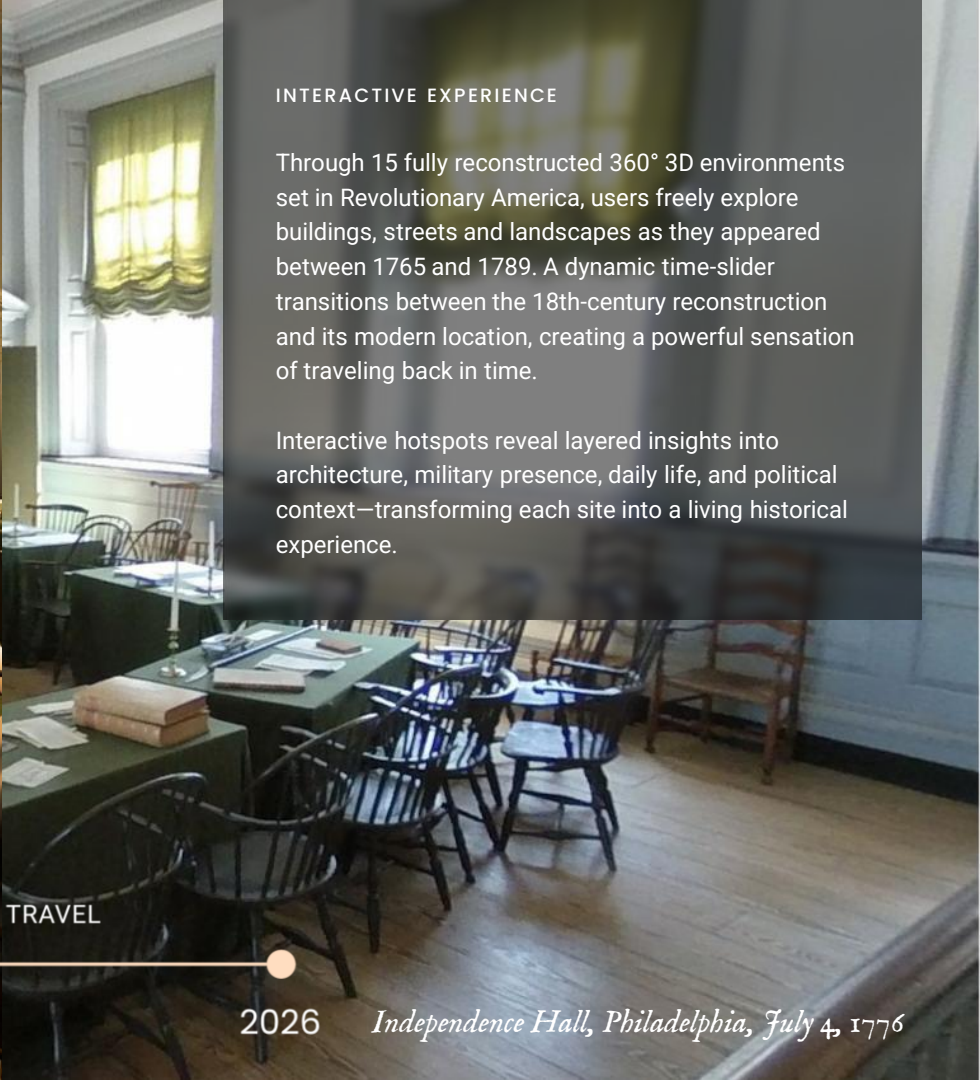

#### INTERACTIVE EXPERIENCE

Through 15 fully reconstructed 360° 3D environments set in Revolutionary America, users freely explore buildings, streets and landscapes as they appeared between 1765 and 1789. A dynamic time-slider transitions between the 18th-century reconstruction and its modern location, creating a powerful sensation of traveling back in time.

Interactive hotspots reveal layered insights into architecture, military presence, daily life, and political context—transforming each site into a living historical experience.

The war in the South, along with conflicts and alliances across the oceans, broaden the familiar narrative.

They reveal French engagement with the Patriot cause and show how the Revolution stretched from the Atlantic seaboard to distant frontiers, shaping regions far beyond the thirteen colonies through intertwined political, economic, and cultural forces.

The Siege of Pensacola, led by Bernardo de Gálvez, exemplifies this global dimension. Spanish operations on the Gulf Coast decisively weakened British power—a prelude to the decisive victory at Yorktown, made possible by the full support of the French army and French navy.

WAR TALES — EXPLAINING REVOLUTIONARY WARFARE

These five immersive 3D experiences are inspired by a board-game aesthetic, where animated figurines move across meticulously reconstructed Revolutionary battlefields.

Through cinematic sound design, special effects, and guided narration, each episode explains 18th-century colonial warfare, tactical movements, and the dramatic spectacle of battle with both clarity and visual impact. The War Tales collection includes the following five battles:

#### ORIGINAL SOUNDTRACK

Each Immersive scene features a dedicated sound design carefully crafted to reflect documented 18th-century atmospheres. Ambient layers—camp activity, marching boots, distant musket fire, wind through wooden structures—recreate the acoustic texture of the period.

Voice performances incorporate regionally informed accents from across the thirteen colonies and the wider British Empire, reinforcing geographic identity and cultural diversity while grounding the experience in historical authenticity.

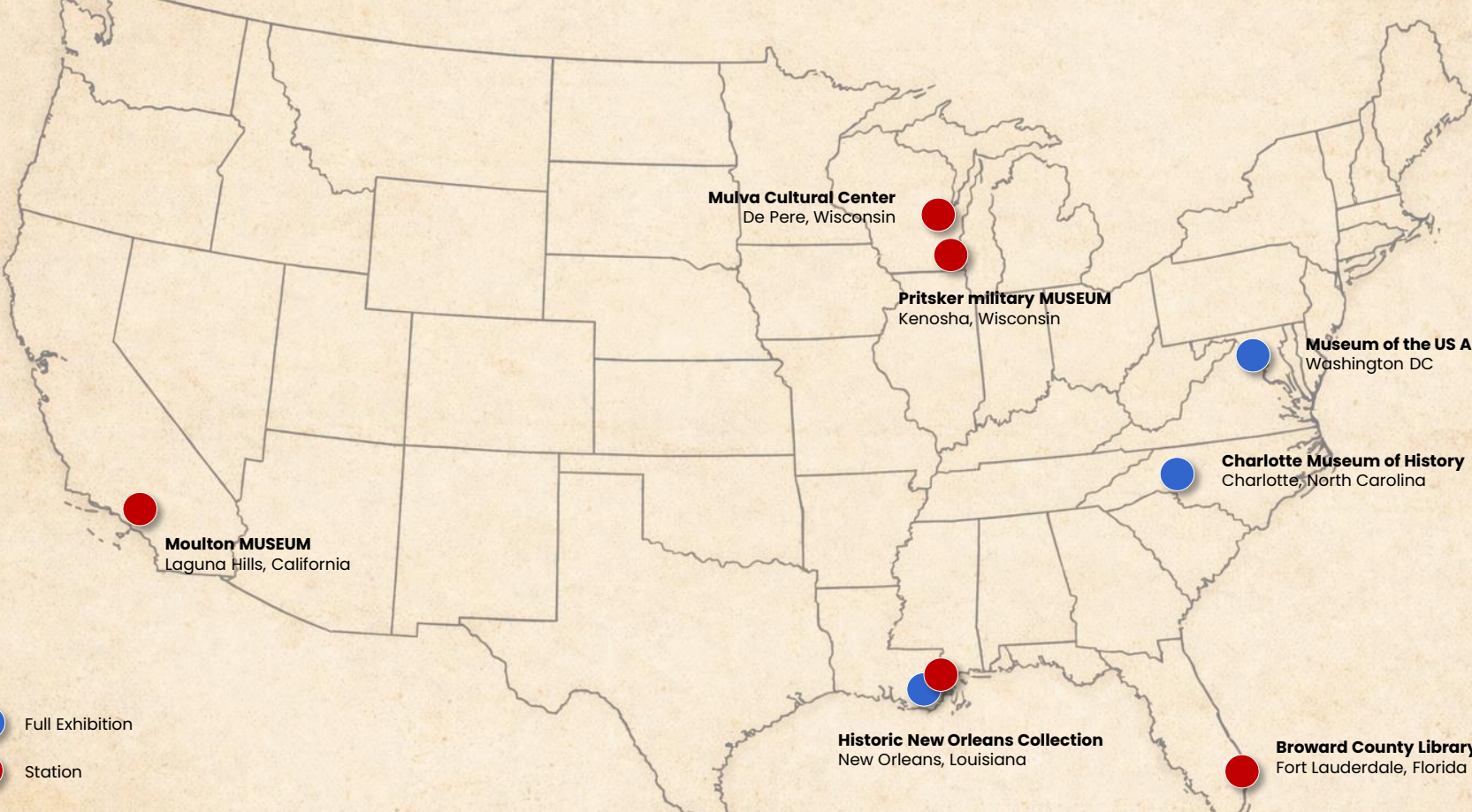
## SCHOOL KITS
